## Good, Better, Best

What makes a cover "excellent"? To be honest, that is very subjective. It depends on what you want to receive. We all have differing desires, so a cover that is "excellent" for one member may be only "good" for another members tastes

At the same time, members desire to please with the covers which they prepare. I see many covers where the selection of stamps or artwork on the covers shows careful thought in preparing the cover.

When you forward a circuit please remember to rate the covers which you receive. The guidelines for rating covers are on the reverse of the circuit form. If we are honest with one another the quality of covers will go from good, to better, to best.

One note of caution: a frequent negative comment concerns the size of envelope used. Most cover collectors seem to prefer what printers refer to as an "A6" or "announcement" envelope with dimensions of 120 x165 mm or 4.75 x 6.5 inches. That size provides sufficient space for several stamps. But I'd wager that they would appreciate any cover with special stamps. As always, your fellow members thank you for your efforts. Keep up the good work
