Encouraging One Another

When we hear from members who resign from CCCC the most common reason is that they did not receive sufficient or interesting circuits to keep them interested.

That is something we all can correct. CCCC is better as we all work together to make it better. That will not be hard. There are two ways we improve CCCC.

#1 We need to make sure we forward circuits promptly. Ordinarily we should get the circuit on its way to the next member in a day or two; certainly within a week. Sometimes emergencies interfere, but promptness is courteous and appreciated. But I occasionally see circuits which have languished on a member's desk for months. That hurts us all.

#2 We need to use interesting stamps. Pictorial or commemorative stamps are always appreciated. We depend on our postal authorities to provide us with pretty stamps and we should make sure that fellow members receive the very best. Sometimes we need to request our local post offices to give us the most current and colorful, but that makes CCCC better for us all.
